Pharmacy-Based Immunization Delivery certificate training program (14th Edition) is a 20-hour innovative, intensive, and practice-based continuing pharmacy education, based on national educational standards for immunization training from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. This program is designed to educate pharmacists about the professional opportunities for vaccine advocacy and administration. This practice-based curriculum represents a fusion of science and clinical pharmacy. The program, which emphasizes a health care team approach, seeks to foster the implementation of interventions that will promote disease prevention and public health.

Pharmacy-Based Immunization Delivery certificate training program has three components: online interactive self-study with assessment; the live seminar with online final assessment; and hands-on assessment of intramuscular and subcutaneous injection technique. A Certificate of Achievement will be awarded to participants who successfully complete all program components, including an evaluation.

In addition to enrollment in the immunization certificate training program, your \$199 registration fee will also provide you with an automatic free enrollment in **APhA's Test Your Knowledge: Immunization Delivery**. This **free 2-hour online CPE program** will be sent to you six months later and will provide you with a review of the information you experience in the certificate training program. It will also provide any up-to-date immunization information six months following the certificate training program. You are not obligated to participate in this CPE program, but it is provided to you free as part of your enrollment in the immunization certificate program. It is supported by a grant from Merck. * To complete the required injection technique assessment exercise each participant must identify an immunizing pharmacist who is licensed to administer vaccinations in their state. This pharmacist will be responsible for observing the participant during the injection technique exercise. The demonstrated technique will include giving a willing partner 2 intramuscular and 1 subcutaneous injections of normal saline. Participant must identify a partner to be the simulated patient. Participant must be able to procure the supplies listed to the right which are needed for the injection technique exercise. This must be done by the program participant. APhA will not be able to ship supplies to you.

- (2) 1" safety syringes (1mL 25G x 1" preferred or 3mL)
- (1) 5/8" safety syringe (1mL 25G x 5/8" preferred or 3mL)
- (1) vial sodium chloride.
- Bandages, alcohol swabs, cotton balls, gloves and sharps disposal
