APhA/WSU Pharmacy-Based Immunization Administration by Pharmacy Technicians training program explores the expanding role of the pharmacy technician by providing additional skills training to administer immunizations. This two-part program emphasizes a health care team collaboration between pharmacists and technicians which seeks to improve population health by increasing immunization rates in states that allow technicians to immunize.



Composed of an online self-study component combined with a live seminar that teaches hands-on immunization techniques, this program will provide a total of six hours of continuing education for technicians and pharmacists.

The goals of this program are to:

- Educate pharmacy technicians about:
- Describe proper technique when drawing up and administering immunizations
- Recognize commonly used vaccines and their corresponding routes of administration
- Distinguish proper needle length selection based on vaccine and patient age and size
- Identify proper documentation procedures
- Recall vaccine storage requirements
- Describe safety measures to avoid accidental needle stick injuries
- Recognize appropriate actions to take in emergency situations

Live Seminar Learning Objectives:

- Demonstrate a successful technique when administering an intramuscular and subcutaneous injection.
- Demonstrate appropriate distraction techniques during immunization administration.
- Demonstrate the use of universal precautions as they pertain to blood borne pathogens
- Explain the procedures for managing a vaccine reaction emergency

Activity Completion Requirements

To obtain credit for " **Pharmacy-Based Immunization Administration by Pharmacy Technicians**" the learner must:

1. Complete home study activities *prior* to the live seminar - 2 hours
2. Complete both home study and final assessments with a grade of 70% or better
3. Attend the live virtual seminar with enabled audio and video. We MUST see YOU!
4. Successfully complete the injection technique assessment
5. Complete all online evaluations, and CLAIM credit.

To obtain credit, the Learner must CLAIM credit once each component is completed. Once credit is claimed, Transcripts of CPE will be available online within 24 hours on the Learner's CPE Monitor profile. The Certificate of Achievement will be available online upon successful completion of the necessary activity requirements on the participant's "My Training" page on www.pharmacist.com.

Skills Assessment Successful Completion

To complete the program and receive your certificate, you must sign up for a virtual skills assessment. Skills assessment appointments will be available April 16, 2022. You must adapt your schedule to the availability of the skill assessment faculty. Participants must demonstrate (live) proper intramuscular and subcutaneous injections into an individual. Participants will be responsible for finding a volunteer to be injected, as well as obtaining the following supplies required for the assessment. Please note, the participant must utilize at least two types of **safety needles** for their injection demonstrations. The certified pharmacist immunizer will be required to sign an injection technique assessment form attesting to proper injection technique. All participants during the skills assessment must adhere to PPE standards required by the state of Illinois at the time of the assessment. Masks are required at a minimum.

Items required include:

- Non latex gloves (minimum 1 pair)
- 3 - 3ml x 25G x 1" safety syringe
- 2 - 3ml x 25G x 5/8" safety syringe
- Alcohol swabs (Minimum 4)
- Sodium chloride 0.9% (single dose vial, 10 ml or smaller).

The items above can also be purchased from IPhA during the online registration process.

Also required: *The learner is required to provide the following.*

- Sharps container or proper disposal device
- Hand sanitizer
- Band-aids - (minimum 3)
- Cotton balls (minimum 3)
- You must also provide your own patient on which to demonstrate the injection technique for assessment. This person must be 18 years of age or older.

Purchased skills kits will be mailed a week prior to the course.
