Highlights for 2017-2018

NAPLEX

Graduates of SIUE School of Pharmacy (SOP) class of 2017 achieved a first-attempt board pass rate of 92.86 percent on the North American Pharmacist Licensure Exam (NAPLEX). The graduates' combined score was the highest board pass rate in Illinois or Missouri and exceeded the 2017 state and national averages of 84.52 percent and 87.95 percent, respectively. The NAPLEX results place SIUE in the top 30 percent of all pharmacy programs in the country. When all SIUE graduating classes (2009-2017) are considered together, the first-attempt board pass rate is 95.7%.

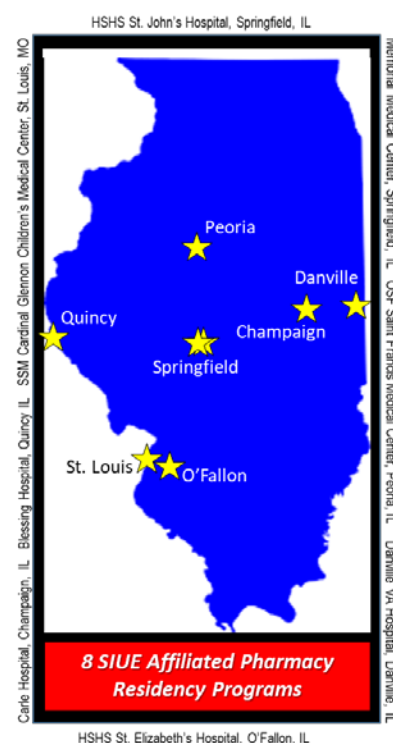
Residency Training

For School of Pharmacy graduates seeking to advance their educations and healthcare careers, pharmacy residency programs provide one such avenue. The SIUE SOP has a strong history of successfully matching graduates with residency positions, this year landing in the top 10 percent of schools across the nation. This year, 84 percent of SOP graduates pursuing residencies obtained a match, exceeding the national average of 66 percent.

In addition to graduates seeking residencies, SIUE has been very active throughout the region assisting health systems in developing their own residency programs. Currently, there are eight SIUE-affiliated pharmacy residency programs throughout Illinois and St. Louis.

Admission Demographics for Class of 2022

The Class of 2022 represents the most diverse cohort of students in the history of the SOP with 27% being students of color and half of those self-identified as underrepresented minority students. The 82 students enter with an average cumulative GPA of 3.62 and an average composite PCAT score of 60; both figures far exceed the national averages for students admitted into Doctor of Pharmacy programs.
